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## TIPPING ON SAFARI

*A thank-you, never an obligation*

Tipping in Africa isn't required, but it is a kind way to thank the people who make your journey memorable — and even small amounts have a big impact. Use this guide if you're unsure, and always tip based on the service you receive.

### CAMP STAFF

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- USD 30–50 per couple, per night.
- There is usually a communal tip box in camp — this is shared by the camp team and does not go to your guide.

### GUIDES

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- USD 50 per couple, per night.
- Tip your guide directly at the end of your safari — envelopes make this easy.

### TRACKERS

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- USD 10–15 per couple, per day with your tracker.
- Tip your tracker separately at the end. Not every camp uses trackers.

### EXTRAS & SMALL NOTES

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- If someone is exceptional, feel free to tip them separately — that is exactly what it's for.
- Bring about USD 50 in one-dollar bills for porters, drivers and helping hands along the way — small notes make showing appreciation simple.
- In Africa, cash is king — cards are rarely useful for tipping.

#### THE GOLDEN RULE

All figures are suggestions only. Tipping is always at your discretion and should reflect the service you've received.
